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## Composer Notes

Our penitential rites and celebrations ought to maintain a sense of praise in them, a surety that the mercy of God is already there, just as our celebration of Lent assumes the joyful knowledge of Easter. These two pieces attempt to convey that joy inside our tears, both lyrically and musically.

The first piece revisits the beautiful ancient Gregorian chant *Attende Domine*, written for our monks at New Camaldoli Hermitage in Big Sur, California. I find it interesting to note that this mode is what we would call a major key in modern music; it's not a modality typically associated with penitence. In the lyrics, I have tried to incorporate new images for the persons of the Trinity, specifically as they relate to healing from sin.

When we sing this piece, the guitar provides an ostinato and the vibraphone (or piano, harp, or bells) provides a wash of open fifths to gently support the chant. The melody does not need to fit in perfectly with the ostinato; it can merely “float” on top of it. “Leave the Past in Ashes” was written for the Saint Bernard of Clairvaux Parish in Tulsa, Oklahoma. It employs the little-used antiphon from Joel 2 that the *Roman Missal* offers to accompany the distribution of ashes. The verses from Psalm 30 again convey the praise that is already implicit in the prayer for mercy.

I like that this piece gently alternates between a major and minor mode. It is good to support it with some percussion to keep the piece from getting too heavy. On the recording, we used an Indian *tabla* playing in *keharwa taal* (a rhythmic pattern with 8 beats).

These two pieces may be sung as a medley, just like on the recording.




