Composer Notes

The text of this short refrain, so full of hope and joy, is the theme that is meant to carry us liturgically from Ascension to Pentecost. The verse texts are drawn from various entrance and Communion antiphons for the celebrations between those two feasts. This piece, simplicity itself, was written for the monks of our Big Sur monastery, to be sung *a cappella* or with a simple guitar accompaniment. This form, chanted verses alternating with a metered, harmonized refrain, is liturgically very adaptable and useful, especially when the verses are genuinely sung as a recitative at the pace of the proclaimed Word.
